

**Bloomsburg Code Enforcement Department's**  
**POST FLOOD INSPECTION**  
**PROGRESS**

To date (10-14-11) the Bloomsburg Code Enforcement Department (code office) has inspected over 500 hundred homes. At this point we are still unsure of exactly how many homes have been affected by the flood event. However, we believe that we have made contact with all homes that have been affected. Please keep in mind that although our office received a great deal of volunteer support from Commonwealth Code Services, those volunteers were only able to commit one or two days. Therefore, we are currently functioning with two inspectors while trying to keep up with everyday business.

Areas which received the initial post flood inspection are as follows (as of 10-14-11):

- It is believed that all affected homes have received initial contact.**

We are currently (today) functioning with two inspectors and will be working on:

- Responding to homeowners that were not present during the initial inspection therefore needing said inspection.
- Responding to homeowners to discuss the inspection sheet and answer questions regarding repairs and floodplain regulations.
- Performing electrical inspections for the re-activation of service.
- Processing evaluation letters for homes which received structural damage.
- Meeting with residents to discuss potential substantial damage and repetitive loss claims.
  - o Research such claims and process paperwork.
- Responding to homeowners who have completed all repairs / restoration and are calling for a follow up inspection.

In the near future we plan to:

- Sending postcards to all homeowners who have not received an initial post flood evaluation reminding them to contact our office to schedule the inspection.
- Begin follow up inspections. These inspections will be similar to the initial inspections insofar as we would like to focus on one area at a time. *For example: First St. between Railroad and Leonard.*
