MAYOR'S REMARKS

W. Kreisher announced that an executive session was held on June 18, 2020 from 2:00 p.m. to 2:52 p.m. for an exit interview with a retiring employee.

W. Kreisher announced that an executive session was held on June 22, 2020 from 6:44 p.m. to 6:55 p.m. to discuss personnel matters in the Public Works Department.

W. Kreisher noted that the Shade Tree Commission has been recognized as a Tree City USA for 25 years.

W. Kreisher thanked Steve Savage with Northeastern Automated Technologies, Inc. for their donation to the Bloomsburg Municipal Airport of Wi-Fi equipment in the amount of \$3,875.00.

Citizens Lisa Ziller, Joyce Brobst, and Joe Sabo voiced their concerns with the dog daycare center on E. 9th Street. It was noted that dogs bark excessively all day long, and it has become a disturbance. L. Ziller noted that she has spoken with the Code Enforcement Department and they informed her that there is a noise ordinance. However, she lives in the industrial district, so there is little that can be enforced. Code Enforcement Officer Kyle Bauman suggested that he speak with the business owners and inform them that there is an issue regarding the noise coming from their business.

ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 10 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO OUTDOOR BURNING

On a motion by T. Bell, seconded by J. Huber, and voted on 3 'yes' votes and 4 'no' votes (J. Hummel, J. Huber, V. DeMelfi, W. Kreisher), Council denied adopting amendments to Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances relating to outdoor burning.

On a motion by J. Hummel, seconded by J. Huber, and voted on unanimously, Council approved sending the amendments to chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances relating to outdoor burning back to the Community and Economic Committee for further review.

ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

On a motion by J. Hummel, seconded by B. Crawford, and voted on 6 'yes' votes and 1 'no' vote (V. DeMelfi), Council approved adopting amendments to Chapter 5 of the Code of Ordinances relating to construction and property maintenance.

ADOPTION OF AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING APPLICATIONS FOR MUNICIPAL PERMITS, LICENSES, OR APPROVALS RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG BE DENIED TO THE PROPERTY OWNER IF DELINQUENCIES OF TAXES OR MUNICIPAL CHARGES OR SERIOUS VIOLATIONS OF STATE LAW OR CODES EXIST ON REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE APPLICANT IN THE TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG

Crawford, and voted on unanimously, Council approved adopting an ordinance requiring applications for municipal permits, licenses, or approvals relating to real property located in the Town of Bloomsburg be denied to the property owner if delinquencies of taxes or municipal charges or serious violations of state law or codes exist on real property owned by the applicant in the Town of Bloomsburg.

ADOPTION OF THE EMERGENCY SERVICES BUILDING ENTRY ORDINANCE

On a motion by T. Bell, seconded by J. Garman, and voted on 4 'yes' votes and 3 'no' votes (V. DeMelfi, J. Hummel, B. Crawford), Council approved adopting the emergency services building entry ordinance.

HRI, Inc. informed Council that they will put additional barriers in place to ensure the safety of pedestrians. R. Van Loan noted that he will send out another press release emphasizing that Kidsburg is closed to the public. J. Fritz will install no trespassing sings in higher location so people can't remove them. R. Van Loan also noted that citations would be issued to repeat offenders.
