APPROVAL OF AUTHORIZING THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO ADJUST ASSIGNED FUND BALANCES AS OF YEAR END

On a motion by D. Levan, seconded by S. Costa and voted on unanimously, Council approved authorizing the Town Administrator and the Director of Finance to adjust assigned fund balances as of year end.

APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT WITH CAROL MAS TO PROVIDE PENSION ALLOCATION SERVICES FOR 2ND, 3RD AND 4TH QUARTERS ASSOCIATED WITH THE TOWN'S 2012 AUDIT

On a motion by F. Trump, seconded by C. Howell and voted on unanimously, Council approved an agreement with Carol Mas to provide pension allocation services for 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarters associated with the Town's 2012 audit in the amount of \$700.

APPROVAL OF PAYMENT OF 2013 UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION SOLVENCY FEE

On a motion by C. Howell, seconded by S. Costa and voted on unanimously, Council approved payment of the 2013 unemployment compensation solvency fee in the amount of \$2,646.08.

APPROVAL OF PROPOSAL FROM BROWN AND BROWN INSURANCE FOR 2013 LIABILITY PACKAGE INSURANCE COVERAGE THROUGH EMC INSURANCE

On a motion by B. Kreisher, seconded by D. Levan and voted on unanimously, Council approved a proposal from Brown and Brown Insurance for 2013 liability package insurance coverage through EMC Insurance in the amount of \$83,876.

APPROVAL OF PROPOSAL FROM BROWN AND BROWN INSURANCE FOR 2013 WORKERS COMPENSATION INSURANCE COVERAGE THROUGH AMERIHEALTH

On a motion by B. Kreisher, seconded by D. Levan and voted on unanimously, Council approved a proposal from Brown and Brown Insurance for 2013 workers compensation insurance coverage through AmeriHealth in the amount of \$80,702.

CITIZEN TO BE HEARD – OREN HELBOK

Oren Helbok, 705 East Fifth Street, regarding the parking garage study stated, "please don't let it die". He recommended that County Commissioners may be able to assist in funding a study. Also, there is the possibility of partnering with the University Foundation. Oren asked Council to put it in the budget as a symbol that it isn't going "to die".

D. Levan stated that the Foundation has indicated that they are not interested and the County is not interested until the garage is ready to be built. Mayor Knorr stated that possibly CDBG planning funds could be used for the study. B. Kreisher and E. Bower support using CDBG funds for the study. F. Trump would prefer to look at studies from other places and is not interesting in having a parking garage in Bloomsburg but he has an open mind. S. Costa stated that at the Pennsylvania Municipal League Convention she heard that parking garages are not feasible and sustainable. Council was not interested in opening the budget to allocate funds for the study; rather they will look to use CDBG funds as a possibility.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:38 p.m.
