## Public Works & Environmental Committee Minutes Tuesday, August 1, 2023 10 a.m.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. in attendance were Council members James Garman, Nick McGaw (10:01 a.m.), Jim Huber, Vince DeMelfi, Town Manager/Secretary/Treasurer Lisa Dooley, Director of Governmental Services Charles Fritz, Director of Public Works John Fritz, Airport Coordinator BJ Teichman, Director of Finance Kim Pogash and Administrative Assistant Christine Meeker. Also in attendance were MJ Mahon, Leslie Temple and Brian Bercher and his wife.

On a motion by J. Huber, seconded by N. McGaw, and voted on unanimously, the Committee approved the Public Works & Environmental Committee minutes from the 7/11/2023 meeting.

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Huber, and voted on unanimously, the Committee recommends Council approve Katya Newcomer to job shadow the Airport Coordinator until August 2023 start of school.

Discussion took place regarding the renaming of a street/alley in honor of a person and the pros and cons. It is the recommendation of the solicitor to not move forward with this request. The Committee concurs with this opinion.

C. Fritz requested permission to investigate the automation of the compost site with a gated entry system and camera surveillance.

C. Fritz updated the Committee on the county solid waste/recycling plan. He has made a request to be named the county recycling coordinator.

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Huber, and voted on unanimously, the Committee recommends Council approve to accept the Degenstein Foundation Grant in the amount of \$50,000 for the purchase of pool assets.

L. Dooley updated the Committee on two RFQ's that are currently out to bid. The first is PennDOT Snarl Traffic Signal Tech Grant to interconnect all traffic signals. The bid opening for engineering services is scheduled for August 14, 2023. The second is engineering, planning and architectural services for the airport with the bid opening scheduled for August 31, 2023.

Updates were given on the Honeysuckle Stormwater project, BART project, parking lot projects and road paving.

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Huber, and voted on unanimously, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG, § 15-203. ENTITLED "ONE WAY STREETS ESTABLISHED"

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Bloomsburg (the "Town") enacted Chapter 15 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Bloomsburg (the "Code") which regulates Motor Vehicles and Traffic; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town enacted § 15-203. of Chapter 15 of the Code which has established certain one-way highways in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to amend § 15-203. of Chapter 15 of the Code as set forth herein

AND NOW be it ORDAINED and ENACTED by the Bloomsburg Town Council, as follows:

1. The following shall be added to Subsection 1. of § 15-203 of Chapter 15:

Highway	From	То	Direction of Travel			
Fort McClure Boulevard	Railroad Street	Driveway Entrance to Streater Field	West and then North			


- 2. The Town of Bloomsburg shall install signage and/or highway markings designating the one-way direction of travel in such locations as it deems appropriate.
- 3. This Ordinance shall not be enforced nor shall signage and/or highway markings designating this portion of Fort McClure Boulevard as a permanent one-way highway be installed until the Bloomsburg Area River Trail Project has reached the point of completion necessitating one-way travel on Fort McClure Boulevard.

Re: Bloomsburg Municipal Airport (N13) Annual Safety Inspection

Dear Ms. Teichman:

On July 26, 2023, an airport safety inspection and Airport Master Record (5010) update were conducted at the Bloomsburg Municipal Airport. This letter outlines the findings by our regional Aviation Safety Specialist, Mr. Drake Burns, and includes a copy of the updated Airport Master Record (Form 5010-1) for your review. Please note an immediate action requirement in paragraph A. 2 (Runway 27 night approach).

- A. <u>Inspection Findings</u>. The airport was found to be generally well maintained, with the following items noted, some not in conformance with Pennsylvania Aviation Regulations:
  - 1. <u>Approach Surface</u> Regulations Relating to Pennsylvania Avn 471.7(a), Criteria A (d): The following objects penetrate the 20:1 approach surface for the runway indicated and should be removed, lowered, or action taken to mitigate the FAR Part 77 approach hazards:

#### Runway 09

- a. Tree 965' out, 67' right, 42' high (18:1 slope).
- b. Public Road 386' out, across centerline, 12' high (15' vehicle height added; 15:1 slope).
- c. Tree 1,361' out, 101' left, 67' high (17:1 slope).

#### Runway 27

Tree 263' out, 122' left, 17' high (3:1 slope).\*

NOTE: The asterisked item above also penetrates the threshold siting surface (20:1 to the runway end), as per FAA AC 150/5300-13B. The safety of a night approach is predicated on the 20:1 threshold siting surface being clear of obstructions. Due to the severity of the above obstructions and lack of nighttime visual aids, the Bureau recommends closing Runway 27 for night approaches until the hazards are mitigated.

A Notice to Air Missions (NOTAM) should be posted prohibiting night approaches to Runway 27 until mitigating action can be implemented.

If you are unable to remove or lower the obstructions, a displaced threshold in excess of 66' would be necessary to provide a clear 20:1 approach slope over current obstructions (not considering future growth).

Please contact this office if you intend to establish a displaced threshold. Please detail your plans in your response letter.

NOTE: The Bureau recognizes that a significant amount of tree removal has taken place; however, some trees continue to obstruct the approach path into both runways.

NOTE: Left and right are as viewed by a pilot on final approach. Out and back are measured from the runway end, and height is above runway end elevation. Listed obstructions represent the highest objects in an area and may not be the only objects requiring attention.

2. <u>Transitional Surface</u> – Regulations Relating to Pa Avn 471.7(a), Criteria A (f): The following objects penetrate the 7:1 transitional surface of the runway and should be removed, lowered, or reviewed by the FAA for acceptability:

#### Runway 09

- a. Tree 700' out, 550' right, 85' high (6:1 slope).
- b. Tree 833' out, 191' left, 53' high (1:1 slope).

#### Runway 27

- a. Tree 780' out, 267' right, 47' high (4:1 slope).
- b. Numerous trees existing along the southern edge of the runway environment penetrate the airport's transitional surface.

NOTE: The above transitional surface obstructions are considered by the FAA to be **hazards to the runway's navigable airspace** and should be mitigated at the earliest opportunity. If you are unable to remove or lower the transitional trees, recommend completing an FAA Form 7460-1 for a formal assessment by the FAA on their acceptability. The completed form should be forwarded to the Bureau for review and subsequent forwarding to the FAA. Feel free to contact your regional specialist if you need assistance.

3. <u>Wind Indicator</u> – Regulations Relating to Pa Aviation 471.7(a), Criteria A (j): A wind indicator shall be installed at a location that adequately indicates the surface wind direction and velocity. The wind indicator shall be lighted for night operations.

The airfield's wind indicator appeared worn and faded. The Bureau understands that new indicators are in your possession and will be installed at the earliest opportunity.

4. Fuel System – Regulations Relating to Pa Aviation 471.7(a), Criteria A (t):

Each emergency shutoff station shall be placarded "EMERGENCY FUEL SHUTOFF" in letters at least two (2) inches high. **Method of operation shall be indicated by an arrow or by the word "PUSH" or "PULL" as appropriate**. Letters shall be on a background of a contrasting color for ready visibility. Reference NFPA 407, Standard for Aircraft Fuel Servicing.

- B. The following non-regulatory items are noted for your reference:
  - <u>UAS Activity</u> Recommend establishing a UAS outreach plan to forewarn drone
    operators of the precautions and coordination expectations of operating near the airport.
    Airport personnel should be trained on how to coordinate UAS activities that may
    conflict with flight operations.
  - 2. Geese Eradication The inspection noted that the airport is experiencing problems with waterfowl. Please note that airport owners can obtain permits to control waterfowl by contacting the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) at https://epermits.fws.gov/eRCGR/geSI.aspx. Permits are issued to control geese through nest and egg destruction, gosling and adult trapping and culling programs, and other lethal or non-lethal control strategies.

Subparagraphs A. 1. through A. 4., as noted above, include deficiencies of the criteria established for licensure of the airport and, unless under waiver by the Bureau, should be corrected or evaluated by the FAA for acceptability. We urge dedicated and timely attention in addressing the above listed concerns. In many cases several options may be available to mitigate a potential hazard. Please acknowledge receipt of this letter within 30 days of its delivery with your plan to address the above issues, and notify your aviation specialist when issues are corrected.

The above described airspace deficiencies may not be all-inclusive. The obstructions identified were taken from the shadow of our vantage point and the full extent of obstructions may yet need to be determined. For this reason, it may be necessary to employ a licensed professional land surveyor for full clarification.

Photographic images are attached to aid in identifying the approach obstructions noted during the inspection. Digital copies of these photos can be made available upon request.
