SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS

- 3. Prepare Preliminary One-Line and Layout Drawings for PPL Interconnection Application Submission based on conceptual design.
- 4. Coordinate with racking manufacturers to layout solar arrays onsite.
- 5. Complete Preliminary Design of proposed arrays. Preliminary Design shall include agreed upon components and racking manufacturer concepts, as well as electrical design criteria such as panels, invertors, combiners, interconnection equipment, etc.
- 6. Complete Final Design per the parameters outlined in the Preliminary Design phase and complete "Issued for Construction" Plans with Specifications which identify and specify equipment, contain a bill of materials, and have adequate plans and details for the construction of the project.

ANTICIPATED PROJECT SCHEDULE

RETTEW's field work can commence within two weeks of notice to proceed at the discretion of the Town. A final report will be issued within 14 business days of finishing the field work.

Design and permitting work would begin within two weeks of notice to proceed. Full engineering and permitting for this size project is anticipated to take approximately two to four months.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Scope of Services. RETTEW Associates, Inc. ("RETTEW") agrees to provide professional services set forth in the Scope of Services to the Client (the "Services") pursuant to these Terms and Conditions (the "Terms"). These Terms, together with the Professional Services Agreement and its attachments, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties concerning the Services. Unless specifically included in the Scope of Services, RETTEW shall not provide any construction phase services including, but not limited to, construction observation of any other contractor's work. RETTEW shall not control, or be responsible for, the construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of any contractor and shall not be responsible for site safety. RETTEW shall not be responsible for procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such procurement responsibilities or other responsibilities are specifically assigned to RETTEW in the Scope of Services.
- Invoices. Client represents and warrants that it possesses the financial resources to fulfill its payment obligations hereunder and that such resources do not rely significantly on contingent, third-party monies. Client agrees to maintain such resources during the term hereof and that the failure to maintain such resources shall constitute a material breach hereof. Unless otherwise agreed, Client will be invoiced every 4 weeks for services performed to date and a final invoice will be timely provided upon completion of the Services. Payment is due on receipt and is past due 30 days from invoice date. Interest will be added after 30 days at the rate of 1.5% per month or partial month overdue. Any right to withhold payment based on errors or discrepancies in the invoice is waived if not identified in writing to RETTEW within 10 days of the date of invoice. Client will reimburse RETTEW's reasonable attorneys' fees and litigation costs incurred in pursuing collection of any amount due from Client, in addition to amounts otherwise due hereunder. Timely payment to RETTEW is a material consideration of this Agreement. RETTEW may suspend or terminate its work upon written notice if any Client invoice is not timely paid. Client agrees to defend, indemnify and hold RETTEW harmless from any damages that may arise due to such suspension or termination.
- 3. Standard of Care. RETTEW shall perform the Services in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same or similar locality. This standard of care shall exclusively be judged as of the time the services are rendered and not according to later standards. RETTEW MAKES NO EXPRESS WARRANTIES, AND EXPRESSLY DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL WARRANTIES IMPLIED BY LAW AS THEY MAY APPLY TO THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING THOSE OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. Client agrees that neither RETTEW nor any of its subconsultants owes any fiduciary duty to Client or agency relationship between Client and RETTEW and that, in any event, RETTEW's course of conduct during the performance of the Services shall not create a fiduciary duty or agency relationship.
- Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Client agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the RETTEW Group harmless from and against any and all manner of demands, claims, liabilities, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' and experts' fees and other reasonable defense costs) arising out of any negligent act or omission, or any breach of this Agreement, by Client or any individual or entity for whose acts Client is responsible. To the fullest extent permitted by law, RETTEW agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the Client Group harmless from and against any and all manner of demands, claims, liabilities, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' and experts' fees and other reasonable defense costs) arising out of any negligent act or omission, or any breach of this Agreement, by RETTEW or any individual or entity for whose acts RETTEW is responsible. With regard to any claims arising out of professional services, any defense obligation assumed by RETTEW shall be interpreted as an obligation to reimburse reasonable defense costs, including but not limited to reasonable attorney's and expert's fees. As used in Paragraphs 4 and 5, a "Group" includes the identified party, its parents, subsidiaries and affiliates, their agents, successors and assigns, or any of their shareholders, directors, partners, members, officers or employees.

5. Limitations of Liability.

- a. RETTEW Group's aggregate liability for damages arising from or related to this Agreement, under any theory of liability, shall not exceed the fees paid by Client for performance of the Services. RETTEW shall only be liable for such damages to the extent caused by its negligence.
- b. If RETTEW fails to include any required item or component of the Project from the drawings, sketches, specifications and other documents in any form provided to or for Client by RETTEW under this Agreement (the "Deliverables"), RETTEW shall correct the omission on the Deliverables without charge to Client and reasonable additional construction costs incurred by the Client due to the omission, but shall not be responsible for the cost of the item or component itself, or the cost of installation.
- c. Neither party Group shall be liable to the other for punitive, exemplary, special, indirect, incidental or consequential damages (including, but not limited to, lost profits, lost revenues, lost business opportunities, loss of use, fines, penalties, and

- loss of or corruption to data) arising from or related to this Agreement, regardless of the theory liability, and even if they have been advised of the possibility of such damages or loss.
- d. RETTEW hereby advises Client that it is willing to negotiate higher limitations of liability than those set forth herein, subject to increased compensation. Client has chosen to enter into this Agreement subject to the above limitations of liability after consideration of the totality of the proposal presented by RETTEW.
- 6. Relationship with Other Consultants and Contractors RETTEW is not responsible for any errors or omissions by other consultants, contractors or their respective subcontractors (collectively, "Contractors"), including, but not limited to, such Contractors' failure to adhere to the Deliverables, regardless of whether or not RETTEW is observing their work. RETTEW owes no duty to any Contractor to discover their errors, omissions or other defects in its work or in the work of its subcontractors. Client will use reasonable efforts to include the following language in its agreements with other Contractors on the Project: "To the fullest extent permitted by law, contractor or consultant expressly waives any claims or causes of action against the project engineer for damages sustained in connection with the project, under any theory of liability, except to the extent that the damages resulted from personal injury or property damage. The project engineer is an intended third-party beneficiary of this provision."
- 7. Termination. In addition to any other termination rights set forth herein, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 7 days written notice if the other party fails materially to perform in accordance with its terms. If the Project is permanently abandoned, this Agreement may be terminated by Client upon at least 7 days written notice to RETTEW. In the event of termination of the Project, Client will compensate RETTEW for Services performed or provided up to its receipt of the written notice of termination, for all reimbursable expenses incurred by RETTEW in furtherance of the Services (whether or not incorporated into the Services prior to termination), and reasonable fees and expenses directly associated with the closing the matter, the latter as approved by Client in advance. Timely payment to RETTEW is a material consideration of this Agreement. Client's failure to make payments in accordance with this Agreement shall constitute substantial non-performance and a cause for termination by RETTEW.
- 8. Insurance. During the term of the Agreement, RETTEW will maintain Workers' Compensation insurance, General Liability insurance, Automobile insurance, and Professional Liability insurance in commercially reasonable amounts. Client will maintain, or require its other contractors or consultants on the Project to maintain, such policies (if applicable) in commercially reasonable amounts. Except to the extent that such waiver would invalidate the applicable insurance coverage, the parties waive all rights against each other and against the contractors, consultants, agents and employees of the other for damages to the extent covered by property insurance, except such rights as they may have to the proceeds of such insurance. Client and RETTEW shall require similar waivers from their contractors, consultants and agents.
- 9. Opinions of Probable Construction Cost. RETTEW's opinions of probable construction cost and other cost opinions or estimates are to be made on the basis of RETTEW's experience and qualifications as an engineer and represent RETTEW's best judgment as an experienced and qualified design professional generally familiar with the industry. However, because RETTEW has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment, or services furnished by others, or over the contractor's methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, RETTEW cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids, or actual construction cost will not vary from opinions of probable construction cost prepared by RETTEW or other cost opinions or estimates. If Client wishes greater assurance as to probable construction costs, Client shall employ an independent cost estimator.
- 10. Disputes. If a dispute arises from or relates to this Agreement or the breach thereof, that cannot be settled through direct discussions, the parties agree to endeavor first to settle the dispute by non-binding mediation administered by the American Arbitration Association under its Construction Industry Mediation Procedures before resorting to litigation. The parties further agree that they may initiate litigation regarding any dispute arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or breach thereof, if mediation does not result in a resolution within 90 days of initiation. Litigation between the parties regarding this Agreement shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction located in the state where the work hereunder is performed. In the event of litigation, the prevailing party shall be entitled to collect its reasonable attorneys' fees, experts' fees and costs related to the litigation from the other party. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the law of the state where the work hereunder is performed, without regard to its principles of conflicts of laws. The parties waive their right, if any, to a jury trial.
- 11. Client Responsibilities. Client will provide access to the site as necessary for RETTEW's performance of the Services. Client will provide, in a timely fashion, complete physical information about the site that may be necessary or desirable for RETTEW to perform the Services. Client will timely review proposals, schedules,

plans, and specifications prepared by RETTEW, and cooperate with RETTEW so that RETTEW may complete the Services in a timely fashion. Failure to provide such timely review may adversely impact scope, schedule and budget related to the Services. RETTEW shall be entitled to rely on information and recommendations provided by Client, and its Contractors without independent evaluation or verification.

- 12. Notice of Defects. Client shall promptly report to RETTEW any defects or suspected defects in the Services, so that RETTEW may take measures to minimize the consequences of such defect. Client will use reasonable efforts to include a similar contractual requirement on its Contractors. Failure by Client, and/or Client's Contractors, to so notify RETTEW shall relieve RETTEW of the costs of remedying the defects to the extent of the additional costs resulting from the failure of prompt notification.
- 13. Underground Utilities. Client will identify to RETTEW, in writing, the locations of known or suspected underground utilities or other underground structures or features at and near the project site that could affect the services to be provided (collectively, "Underground Utilities") and will provide all drawings in its possession or control that identify Underground Utilities. RETTEW will be responsible for the proper siting of underground utilities when provided with proper and accurate information regarding their location. Client agrees to defend, indemnify and hold RETTEW harmless from all penalties, claims and damages it sustains in connection with: (a) Underground Utilities that are not identified to RETTEW as required, not properly identified, or not properly located by municipalities, authorities, or utilities after proper notice (i.e., after calling the applicable state utility locating holline, if one exists), and (b) construction schedules or practices out of RETTEW's control or knowledge that violate state utility locating notice requirements or invalidate otherwise proper utility notification made by RETTEW.

Fees.

- a. Unless expressly stated otherwise in the Scope of Services, the "Total Fee" above is RETTEW's best estimate of the cost of Services required to complete the Project as RETTEW understands it to be defined and is not a cost-not-to-exceed limit on RETTEW's compensation. For fixed fee projects, payment shall be made based on the percent of work completed for each phase of work, unless otherwise agreed. For time and expense (cost plus) projects, billings are based on the hours worked, including travel time portal-to-portal, and reimbursable expenses. Overtime for non-exempt employees will be billed at 1.5 times the hourly rate.
- b. Client is responsible for RETTEW's out-of-pocket expenses incurred in performing the Services, including, but not limited to, travel expenses, outside consultants, approval and permit fees, and any supplemental insurance requested. Reimbursable expenses will be billed at RETTEW's actual cost, plus 15%, except sales tax will be reimbursed at cost and mileage will be reimbursed at the applicable federal rate. Hotels and meals will be billed as a per diem expense as set out in the Rate Schedule.

15. Additional Work.

- a. RETTEW shall be entitled to an equitable increase in compensation if it is required to perform additional work due to changes in Client decisions or Client's failure to make decisions in a timely fashion. Services or tasks beyond those set forth in the Scope of Services (including but not limited to, revisions due to adjustments in the project scope, quality, or budget) are considered "Additional Services" and will be billed at RETTEW's standard hourly rates, unless the parties agree otherwise in a change order or amendment to this Agreement.
- b. If Additional Services are requested, RETTEW will provide Client with a change order or amendment to this Agreement to memorialize the parties' obligations regarding the Additional Services. RETTEW reserves the right to refuse to perform Additional Services until it receives written approval of the change order or amendment from the Client. If RETTEW does not receive such written approval in a timely manner, the project schedule could be impacted.
- 16. Work Product and Intellectual Property. Conditioned on full payment of amounts owed to RETTEW, RETTEW grants Client physical ownership of the Deliverables, and a royalty-free, nontransferable license to use the Deliverables solely for the Project. RETTEW retains all other intellectual property rights in the Deliverables and the intellectual property rights in any other document reduced to tangible form by RETTEW in furtherance of this Agreement. The Deliverables may not be used on any other projects or to complete the Project without RETTEW's consent, which will not be unreasonably withheld. Use of the Deliverables (or the data contained therein) in a manner that is contrary to this paragraph, or any alteration or modification of the Deliverables (or the data contained therein), is at Client's sole risk. Client agrees to defend, indemnify and hold RETTEW harmless from any liability for damages arising from such use, alteration or modification. Payment of all sums due in accordance with the terms of this Agreement is a condition precedent to Client's ownership or use of the Deliverables. Client shall consult with RETTEW before interpreting or clarifying the Deliverables.
- 17. Miscellaneous. There are no third party beneficiaries of this Agreement. There are no understandings or agreements concerning this Project except as expressly stated herein. These Terms cannot be modified, altered, abridged, rescinded or supplemented by any unilateral statement or writing of either party. These Terms control over any subsequent writings, unless specifically and explicitly agreed to by both parties, in

writing. If the Client directs RETTEW to initiate Services before execution of an agreement, these Terms will govern the engagement, unless subsequently agreed by the parties in writing. Neither party may assign this Agreement without the other party's written consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. If any provision hereof is deemed invalid or unenforceable, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect, and binding upon the parties hereto. RETTEW may withdraw or revise the proposal if the Agreement is not executed by Client within 60 days of receipt.

18. CONSTRUCTION SERVICES (If included in Scope of Services)

- 18.1 RETTEW offers construction observation and construction administration services, but does not offer construction management or construction inspection services. (Construction management services are offered by RETTEW's affiliate, RETTEW Field Services, Inc.) RETTEW shall become generally familiar with the progress and quality of that portion of the work within the Scope of Services to determine, in general, if such work is being performed in a manner indicating that such work, when fully completed, will be in accordance with the construction documents. RETTEW shall not be required to make exhaustive or continuous on-site visits observe the quality or quantity of such work. RETTEW's services do not include supervision or direction of the actual work of the contractor, its employees, agents or subcontractors. Client agrees to notify the contractor accordingly. The contractor shall also be informed by Client that neither the presence of RETTEW's field representative nor the observation by RETTEW shall excuse the contractor for defects or omissions in its work.
- 18.2 RETTEW shall not be responsible for any contractor's schedules or failure to carry out the work in accordance with the construction documents. RETTEW shall not have control over or charge of acts or omissions of any contractor, subcontractor, or their agents or employees, or of any other persons performing portions of the construction work.
- 18.3 Client agrees that its contractor will be solely and completely responsible for working conditions on the job site, including safety of all persons and property during the performances of the work, and that these requirements will apply continuously and not be limited to normal working hours. Any observation of the contractor's performance conducted by RETTEW's personnel will not include review of the adequacy of the contractor safety measures in, on or near the construction site. RETTEW is not responsible for any contractor's failure to observe or comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1970, and regulations or standards promulgated thereunder, or any state, county, or municipal law or regulation of similar import or intent.
- 18.4 If expressly required under the Scope of Services to do so, RETTEW shall review contractors' submittals within 10 business days of their submission, but only for the limited purpose of checking for conformance with information given and the design concept expressed in the construction documents. Review of such submittals is not conducted for the purpose of determining the accuracy and completeness of other details such as dimensions and quantities or for substantiating instructions for installation or performance of equipment or systems designed by any contractor, all of which remain the responsibility of the contractor. RETTEW's review shall not constitute approval of safety precautions or of construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures and RETTEW does not check or review the methods by which the contractor intends to execute the design. A recommendation for payment shall not be construed as permitting any departure from the contract between Client and the contractor or the construction documents, and the contractor shall remain responsible for any error in details, dimensions or otherwise that may exist. RETTEW's review and acceptance of shop drawings or submittals does not constitute approval or acceptance of design changes contained therein unless the contractor has specifically informed RETTEW in writing of such deviation at the time of the submittal and (1) RETTEW and Owner have given written approval to the specific deviation as a prior change in the work, or (2) a change order has been issued authorizing the deviation. When professional certification of performance characteristics of materials, systems or equipment is required by the construction documents, RETTEW shall be entitled to rely upon such certification to establish that the materials, systems or equipment will meet the performance criteria required by the construction documents.
- 18.5 If the Scope of Services includes RETTEW's review of contractors' requests for payment, then such services shall be conducted in the following manner. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, RETTEW shall, within 10 business days from the date of receipt by RETTEW, review and evaluate such requests for payment based upon RETTEW's observations of the work and give Client its recommendations regarding such request. RETTEW's recommendations shall constitute a statement to Client as of the date of the contractor's request, that: (a) the work has progressed to the point indicated; and (b) that to the best of RETTEW's knowledge, information and belief, the quality of the work is consistent with the construction documents prepared by RETTEW and there are no known defects or deficiencies in the work for which Client should withhold payment under applicable law. The foregoing statements shall be interim only, shall be subject to an evaluation of the completed work compared to the construction documents, if requested by Client, and do not guarantee against minor deviations from the construction documents as of the date of the review.

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined it to be in the best interests of the Town of Bloomsburg and the general public to adopt a Code Blue Emergency Policy; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Code Blue Emergency Policy is intended to provide notice of adverse winter weather conditions to the general public and social services agencies that provide services to at-risk individuals living outdoors, on the streets, in parks or poorly insulated settings, and those who may find themselves at risk for cold related exposure due to defects in at home heating systems.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Bloomsburg of Columbia County hereby adopts the Code Blue Emergency Policy attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A" ("the Policy").

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor may declare a Code Blue Emergency, in accordance with the Policy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, as part of the Plan, the County may by separate resolution enter into agreements with non-profit organizations in order to provide all qualified at-risk individuals in the Town of Bloomsburg the opportunity to obtain temporary shelter in the event of a Code Blue Emergency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in an emergency situation, as declared by the Mayor the Town is hereby authorized to enter into agreements with non-profit organizations without the need for a separate resolution of this Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all agreements entered into with non-profit organizations shall contain indemnification clauses that shall indemnify and absolve the Town of any liability for issues, harm, or damage that may occur, and shall provide that such shelter may only be provided on a Code Blue Emergency and shall provide that the agreement may be terminated at any time, by either party.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Mayor's declaration Code Blue Emergency shall also ensure that such non-profit organizations have been readied and appropriately contracted with, as outlined above, to provide for such arrangements, when the Alert is declared.



SECOND AMENDMENT TO GRANT AGREEMENT

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT to Community Conservation Partnerships Program – Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant Agreement No. LWCF 42-01608 ("Amendment") is entered into by and between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania ("Commonwealth"), acting through the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources ("Department") and Bloomsburg Town ("Grantee").

The parties entered into Grant Agreement No. LWCF 42-01608 ("Agreement") on January 21, 2020. Under the Agreement, the Department granted to Grantee funds under the federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965 (16 U.S.C. §§ 460*l*–4 – 460*l*–11) for rehabilitation and further development of Town Park. On September 2, 2022, the Department granted to Grantee an extension to June 30, 2024. The parties now wish to amend the terms of the Agreement to increase federal Land and Water Conservation Fund monies to cover high bids.

The parties intending to be legally bound, agree that the Agreement shall be amended as follows:

 Article III is struck entirely and replaced with the following:
 Compliance with Applicable Statutes, Regulations and Other Requirements

Compliance with statutes, regulations, and other requirements: The GRANTEE shall comply with all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations and local ordinances; any correspondence and instructions that may be provided by the DEPARTMENT; all conditions and requirements in Appendix A; and all terms and conditions in this GRANT AGREEMENT. If the DEPARTMENT has provided a program manual, such manual, including any addenda, is incorporated herein by reference, and the GRANTEE shall comply with its provisions.

Contractor Responsibility and Offset Provisions: The GRANTEE shall comply with the provisions in Appendix B, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Contractor Integrity Provisions: The GRANTEE shall comply with the provisions in Appendix C, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Nondiscrimination/Sexual Harassment Clause: The GRANTEE shall comply with the provisions in Appendix D, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Right-to-Know Law: The GRANTEE shall comply with the provisions in Appendix E (Right-to-Know Law) as applicable.

Automated Clearing House (ACH) Payments: The GRANTEE shall comply with the provisions in Appendix F (Automated Clearing House (ACH) Payments).

Americans With Disabilities Act: The GRANTEE shall comply with the provisions in Appendix G, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Universal Accessibility Act; Rehabilitation Act, Architectural Barriers Act of 1968: In its performance under this GRANT AGREEMENT, the GRANTEE shall comply with applicable requirements of the following acts, as amended: Universal Accessibility Act, 71 P.S. 1455.1 et seq.; Section 504 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. 794; and the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, 42 U.S.C. 4151 et seq.

Federal funding: If any portion of the grant awarded to the GRANTEE is federal money, the GRANTEE, in addition to complying with the provisions of this article, shall also comply with the requirements in Appendix H attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Post-completion responsibilities: The GRANTEE'S responsibilities under federal, state, and local statutes, regulations, and ordinances with respect to the site or other product of this grant continue beyond the GRANT AGREEMENT period.

The term "site" means the properties and facilities, including any portion of them, acquired, rehabilitated, or developed under this GRANT AGREEMENT.

2. Article XXV CONSTRUCTION, is struck entirely and replaced with the following:

This GRANT AGREEMENT shall be governed by and interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (without regard to any conflict of laws provisions) and the decisions of the Pennsylvania courts. The GRANTEE consents to the jurisdiction of any court of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and any federal courts in Pennsylvania, waiving any claim or defense that such forum is not convenient or proper. The GRANTEE agrees that any such court shall have in personam jurisdiction over it, and consents to service of process in any manner authorized by Pennsylvania law. All terms and conditions of this GRANT AGREEMENT are intended to be covenants as well as conditions. The titles of the articles and paragraphs are inserted for convenience

and do not control or affect the meaning or construction of any terms or provisions of this GRANT AGREEMENT.

3. The "PROJECT BUDGET" section on page 1 of Appendix A of the Agreement is struck and replaced with the following:

This Amendment shall become effective when it is fully executed by the parties and all approvals required by Commonwealth contracting procedures have been obtained, as indicated by the date of the last Commonwealth signature. This Amendment is not binding in any way on the Commonwealth or the Department until it has been fully executed, as prescribed in the preceding sentence, and sent to the Grantee.
- 8. Capitalized terms used in this Amendment and not otherwise defined in this Amendment shall have the meanings specified for such terms in the Agreement.

9. Except as explicitly provided by this Amendment, the other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

APPENDIX B

CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY AND OFFSET PROVISIONS

For the purpose of these provisions, the term Contractor is defined as any person, including, but not limited to, a bidder, offeror, loan recipient, grantee or lessor, who has furnished or performed or seeks to furnish or perform, goods, supplies, services, leased space, construction or other activity, under a contract, grant, lease, purchase order or reimbursement agreement with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Commonwealth). The term Contractor includes a permittee, licensee, or any agency, political subdivision, instrumentality, public authority, or other public entity in the Commonwealth.

Contractor Responsibility Provisions

- 1. The Contractor certifies, in writing, for itself and its subcontractors required to be disclosed or approved by the Commonwealth, that as of the date of its execution of this Bid/Contract, that neither the Contractor, nor any such subcontractors, are under suspension or debarment by the Commonwealth or any governmental entity, instrumentality, or authority and, if the Contractor cannot so certify, then it agrees to submit, along with its Bid/Contract, a written explanation of why such certification cannot be made.
- 2. The Contractor also certifies, in writing, that as of the date of its execution of this Bid/Contract it has no tax liabilities or other Commonwealth obligations, or has filed a timely administrative or judicial appeal if such liabilities or obligations exist, or is subject to a duly approved deferred payment plan if such liabilities exist.
- 3. The Contractor's obligations pursuant to these provisions are ongoing from and after the effective date of the Contract through the termination date thereof. Accordingly, the Contractor shall have an obligation to inform the Commonwealth if, at any time during the term of the Contract, it becomes delinquent in the payment of taxes, or other Commonwealth obligations, or if it or, to the best knowledge of the Contractor, any of its subcontractors are suspended or debarred by the Commonwealth, the federal government, or any other state or governmental entity. Such notification shall be made within 15 days of the date of suspension or debarment.
- **4.** The failure of the Contractor to notify the Commonwealth of its suspension or debarment by the Commonwealth, any other state, or the federal government shall constitute an event of default of the Contract with the Commonwealth.
- **5.** The Contractor agrees to reimburse the Commonwealth for the reasonable costs of investigation incurred by the Office of State Inspector General for investigations of the Contractor's compliance with the terms of this or any other agreement between the Contractor and the Commonwealth that results in the suspension or debarment of the contractor. Such costs shall include, but shall not be limited to, salaries of investigators, including overtime; travel and lodging expenses; and expert witness and documentary fees. The Contractor shall not be responsible for investigative costs for investigations that do not result in the Contractor's suspension or debarment.
- **6.** The Contractor may search the current list of suspended and debarred Commonwealth contractors by visiting the eMarketplace website at http://www.emarketplace.state.pa.us and clicking the Debarment List tab.

Offset Provision

The Contractor agrees that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Commonwealth) may set off the amount of any state tax liability or other obligation of the Contractor or its subsidiaries to the Commonwealth against any payments due the contractor under any contract with the Commonwealth.

AMENDMENT TO AND AGREEMENT REGARDING LEASE

(P3 TOBC-1 – PATTERSON DRIVE)

THIS AGREEMENT (this "<u>Agreement</u>") is made effective this ____ day of November, 2023, by and between **TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG**, a municipality incorporated with an address of 301 East Second Street, Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania 17815 (hereinafter referred to as "<u>Owner</u>") and **P3 TOBC-1**, **LLC**, a Pennsylvania limited liability company with an address of 2660 Kutztown Road, Pennsburg, Pennsylvania 18073 (hereinafter referred to as "<u>Company</u>").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Company and Owner are parties to that certain Site Lease Agreement dated February 24, 2021 (the "Site Lease Agreement"), pursuant to which Company leased from Owner certain real property owned by Owner located in Columbia County, Pennsylvania and by which Owner granted Company certain access and utility easements (the "Premises");

WHEREAS, to evidence the existence of the Site Lease Agreement, Company and Owner executed that certain Memorandum of Site Agreement which was recorded in the real estate records of Columbia County, Pennsylvania on November 29, 2021, as Instrument Number 202111930 (the "Memorandum of Lease") (the Site Lease Agreement and the Memorandum of Lease collectively referred to herein as the "Lease"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a Unit Purchase Agreement by and among Company, the members of the Company ("Members") and TowerOne Partners, LLC, a Pennsylvania limited liability company (hereinafter referred to as "TowerOne"), the Members will sell, transfer, assign and deliver to TowerOne, and TowerOne will purchase, acquire, assume and accept from the Members, all of the issued and outstanding membership interests of Company; and

WHEREAS, Owner and Company desire to enter into this Agreement to provide for: (i) certain matters pertaining to the Lease, and (ii) the amendment of the Lease to ensure that an updated "as built" legal description and survey of the Premises are attached to the Lease and recorded in the real estate records of Columbia County, Pennsylvania.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, and with the intent to be legally bound, Owner and Company agree as follows:

1. <u>Estoppel</u>.

- (a) Company is the current tenant under the Lease, and the Lease is in full force and effect, and, as amended hereby, contains the entire agreement between Owner and Company with respect to the Premises.
- (b) No default exists under the Lease on the part of Company, and, to Owner's knowledge, no event or condition has occurred or exists which, with notice or the passage of time or both, would constitute a default by Company under the Lease.
 - (c) Owner is the owner of the fee interest in the Premises.
- (d) The individual executing this Agreement on behalf of Owner is authorized to do so and has the full power to bind Owner.
- (e) In the event Company's lender or, should TowerOne or another affiliate of Company or TowerOne (each, a "Permitted Affiliate") succeed Company as tenant under the Lease for any reason, in the event a Permitted Affiliate's lender (such then-current lender, together with its successors and assigns, "Lender") takes on all rights and responsibilities of the Lease and exercises any rights of Company or a Permitted Affiliate under the Lease, including the right to exercise Company's renewal option(s) or purchase option(s) set forth in the Lease, Owner agrees to accept such exercise of rights by Lender as if same had been exercised by Company or a Permitted Affiliate.
- (f) If there shall be a monetary default by Company or a Permitted Affiliate under the Lease, Owner shall accept the cure thereof by Lender within any grace period provided to Company or such Permitted Affiliate under the Lease to cure such default, prior to terminating the Lease. If there shall be a non-monetary default by Company or a Permitted Affiliate under the Lease, Owner shall accept the cure thereof by Lender within any grace period provided to Company or such Permitted Affiliate under the Lease to cure such default prior to terminating the Lease.
- (g) Company represents and warrants that, upon acquisition by TowerOne of all of the issued and outstanding membership interests of the Company, the Lease shall remain

in full force and effect as a binding contractual obligation of the Company, except as otherwise modified herein.

- 2. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding on Owner, Company and TowerOne and their respective successors and assigns and shall inure to the benefit of Lender.
- 3. Amendment Due to Updated As-Built Survey. Owner, Company and TowerOne acknowledge that the survey attached hereto as Exhibit A was commissioned by TowerOne and includes an "as-built" depiction of the Premises, and the parties hereby agree that the legal descriptions and depiction attached to the Site Lease Agreement as Exhibit A and attached to the Memorandum of Lease as Exhibit A, shall be amended and replaced in their entireties by Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 4. Execution and Counterparts. To facilitate execution, the parties hereto agree that this Agreement may be executed and telecopied or emailed to the other parties and that the executed telecopy or emailed copy shall be binding and enforceable as an original; provided, however, that, if this document is to be recorded, at least one original signature of Owner and Company shall be provided to TowerOne for recordation purposes. This Agreement may be executed in as many counterparts as may be required and it shall not be necessary that the signature of, or on behalf of, each party, or that the signatures of all persons required to bind any party, appear on each counterpart; it shall be sufficient that the signature of, or on behalf of, each party, or that the signatures of the persons required to bind any party, appear on one or more of such counterparts.

PUNCHLIST COMPLETION AGREEMENT

This Punchlist Completion Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this day of ______, 2023, by and between PREMIER POOL RENOVATIONS, INC. (the "Contractor") and the TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG (the "Owner")

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, the Contractor performed certain renovations to the Norris E. Rock Memorial Pool located in the Town of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania, pursuant to the terms of a Completion Agreement dated July 10, 2022 and a First Amendment to Completion Agreement dated February 9, 2023, as well as certain documents incorporated into the same; (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Contractor has submitted a Final Application for Payment ("Final Application") and the parties have agreed that the Contractor has completed all work under the Contract on the Project, with the exception of the Punchlist Items set forth below, and that Contractor is owed the sum of \$212,358.08 (the "Remaining Contract Balance") as full and final payment for all work performed on the Project; and

WHEREAS, Contractor shall be paid the amount of \$181.258.05 within seven (7) days of the date the parties hereto execute this Agreement;

WHEREAS, the amount of \$21,235.81 (the "Punchlist Retainage") shall be held as retainage for completion of the Punchlist Items set forth below and the sum of \$9,864.22 relating to Community Block Development Grant activity for outstanding items to be provided by Premier which are needed for grant compliance/completion (the "Grant Compliance Retainage"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of foregoing premises which are incorporated herein, the agreements and understandings hereinafter set forth, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy therefore being hereby acknowledged and intending to be legally bound hereby, the Owner and the Contractor, agree as follows:

- The items listed in a-m below, constitute the remaining uncompleted items and/or items to be repaired with respect to Contractor's Work at the Norris E. Rock Memorial Pool (the "Punchlist Items"):
 - a. The anchors for the slide in the Wading Pool pulled out of the concrete and will have to be reinstalled.
 - b. Rust spot in the Main Pool that needs to be removed and/or remediated.
 - Installation of a missing sight glass on the filtration system on the backwash lines (main pool and wading pool) (not on plans but agreed to be installed by Contractor).
 - d. Installation of flow meter on Main pool's backwash waste line.
 - Installation of backwash and return Griswold flow valves on Main pool's filtration system.

- f. Installation of flow meter and butterfly valve on Main pool return line.
- g. Installation of T-handle for pit shutoff valves on the Main drain for the Main Pool.
- h. Installation of 1/2" eyeballs for two (2) of the stainless deck jets in the Wading Pool.
- Replacement of two (2) corner coping stones on the wading pool which have cracked and repair of grouting is needed.
- j. Repair of peeling paint on the Wading Pool and spots missing paint.
- k. Repair of peeling paint on the log floatable in the Main Pool.
- Repair of the triangle shaped concrete decking behind Main Pool slide has cracked and will need to be repaired.
- m. Repair of loose decorative fencing.
- The Punchlist Retainage shall be held by the Owner pending completion of the Punchlist Items by Contractor.
- 3. The Punchlist Items shall be completed by Contractor no later than November 1, 2023. In the event the Punchlist Items are not completed by November 1, 2023. unless Contractor is delayed by factors outside his control in which case he will be provided additional reasonable time to complete, the Owner, through its own employees and/or contractors it elects to retain shall have the right to perform any work necessary to complete any Punchlist Items which have not been completed by Contractor by November 1, 2023 and utilize the Punchlist Retainage for the same. Any remaining portion of the Punchlist Retainage after completion of the Punchlist Items by the Owner and/or its contractors shall be returned to Contractor.
- The Grant Compliance Retainage shall be held until such time as Contractor provides all outstanding items which are needed for grant compliance/completion by the Owner.
- This Agreement constitutes the whole of the understanding, discussions, and agreements by and between the Owner and the Contractor solely with respect to completion of the Punchlist Items and Grant Compliance Retainage.
- 6. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the Remaining Contract Balance is the total remaining, unpaid amount which it is due under the Contract with Owner for all Work performed and/or materials provided at the Project site and that it shall not seek any additional reimbursement above the Remaining Contract Balance and does for itself, its successors and assigns, hereby remise, release, and forever discharge the Owner its respective officers, employees, agents and all other persons or other entities of any type, whether or not named herein, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, assigns, assureds and attorneys (collectively the "Releasees") of and from all claims for any additional compensation for Work and/or materials provided on the Project Site to the Owner.
- This Agreement shall not be changed, amended or altered in any way except in writing and executed by both the Owner and Contractor.

- This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original.
- This Agreement shall be governed by and controlled by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and, further, without regard to any presumption or other rule requiring construction against the party causing this Agreement to be drafted.
- 10. Except as otherwise modified herein and as set forth in this Agreement, all of the terms, conditions and provisions of the Completion Agreement, First Amendment to Completion Agreement and the Contract shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect.
- 11. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties and their respective successors and assigns. Contractor shall not have the right to assign its interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of Owner and any attempt to do so shall be null, void and of no force or effect.
- 12. All defined or capitalized terms set forth herein shall have meaning ascribed to them as set forth in the Contract, the Completion Agreement and First Amendment to Completion Agreement.
- 13. In the event of any conflict between the Contract, the Completion Agreement, First Amendment to Completion Agreement and this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall be controlling.
- 14. Time is of the essence with respect to the performance of this Agreement by the Contractor.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed this Agreement on the dates noted below with the last signatory inserting the date above at the beginning of this Agreement. Each of the undersigned individual signing this Agreement represents that he/she is an officer or designated manager or contracting authority of the entity stated and thereby has full authority to enter into this Agreement and to legally bind the entity stated to the terms and provisions herein.

PEDALCYCLES

PART 1

Pedalcycles

§ 3-101. Definitions.

As used in this ordinance, the following words will be deemed to have the meaning set forth herein:

BICYCLE — See Pedalcycle.

BUSINESS DISTRICT—the territory contiguous to and including the entire width between the boundary lines of every street maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel when within any 600 feet along the street there are buildings in use for business or industrial purposes, which occupy at least 300 feet of frontage on one side or 300 feet collectively on both sides of the street.

COMMONWEALTH — The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

DRIVER — a person who drives or is in actual physical control of a Pedalcycle.

ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITYDEVICE (EPAMD) — A self-balancing, non-tandem two wheeled device designed to transport only one person with an electric propulsion system

MOTOR VEHICLE — A vehicle which is self-propelled except an electric personal assistive mobility device or a vehicle which is propelled solely by human power.

MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLE(S) — A motorcycle, including a motor scooter, with a motor which produces not to exceed five brake horsepower.

MOTORIZED PEDALCYCLE(S) — A motor-driven cycle equipped with operable pedals, a motor rated no more than 1.5 brake horsepower, a cylinder capacity not exceeding 50 cubic centimeters, an automatic transmission and a maximum design speed of no more than 25 miles per hour or an electric motor-driven cycle equipped with operable pedals and an automatic transmission powered by an electric battery or battery-pack-powered electric motor with a maximum design speed of no more than 25 miles per hour

PEDALCYCLE(S) (INCLUDES BICYCLE) — A vehicle propelled solely by human-powered pedals or a pedalcycle with electric assist. The term does not mean a three-wheeled human-powered pedal-driven vehicle with a main driving wheel 20 inches in diameter or under and primarily designed for children six years of age or younger.

PEDALCYCLE WITH ELECTRIC ASSIST — A vehicle weighing more than 100 pounds with two or three wheels more than 11 inches in diameter, manufactured or assembled with an electric motor system rate at not more than 750 watts and equipped with operable pedals and capable of a speed not more than 20 miles per hour on a level surface when powered by the motor source only. The term does not include a device specifically designed for use by persons with disabilities.

PEDALCYCLE LANE: a portion of street that has been designated by signs and/or pavement markings for preferential or exclusive use by pedalcycles and/or motorized pedalcycles by the Town.

PEDALCYCLE PATH ---- a path or other area created and/or designated as a pedalcycle, and/or a motorized pedalcycle path by the Town and marked by signs designating such.

PEDESTRIAN — A natural person afoot.

REFLECTOR — Any device which shall be equivalent to at least one inch in diameter, constructed of metal and/or glass, used to reflect light for safety and visibility.

STREET — Any public road, street, alley or trafficway, but not including grassplots or sidewalks.

TOWN — Town of Bloomsburg

TRAFFICWAY — The entire width between property lines or other boundary lines of every way or place of which any part is open to the public for purposes of vehicular travel as a matter of right or custom.

VEHICLE — Every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a street, except devices used exclusively upon rails or tracks. The term does not include a self-propelled wheel chair or an electrical mobility device operated and designed for the exclusive use by a person with a mobility-related disability.

§ 3-102. Operation of Pedalcycles.

Every person operating a pedalcycle upon a street shall be granted all the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the operator of a vehicle by the laws of this Commonwealth declaring rules of the road applicable to vehicles or by the ordinances of this Town applicable to the operator of a vehicle, except as to special regulations in this Chapter and except as to those provisions of laws and ordinances which, by their nature, can have no application.

- a. Riding on Sidewalks. No pedalcycle shall be ridden upon a sidewalk in a business district unless permitted by official traffic control devices, nor when a usable pedalcycle lane has been provided adjacent to the sidewalk within the Town unless permitted by official traffic control devices. No motorized pedalcycles or motor-driven cycles shall be operated upon any sidewalk unless specifically designated by the Town.
- b. No person shall drive any vehicle except a human-powered vehicle upon a sidewalk or sidewalk area except for a vehicle designed for the exclusive use by a person with a mobility-related disability or an EPAMD.
- c. Riding on Streets, Pedalcycle Lanes and Pedalcycle Paths.
 - (1) Every person operating a pedalcycle upon a street, pedalcycle lane and/or pedalcycle path shall ride as near to the right side of the street as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction, and shall ride in the same direction as traffic, unless directed otherwise by the Town.
 - (2) Persons riding on pedalcycles or EPAMD upon a street, pedalcycle paths and/or pedalcycle lanes shall ride to the right side unless designated otherwise.
 - (3) Any person operating a pedalcycle upon a street which carries traffic in one direction only (one-way streets) and has two or more marked lanes may ride as near to the left-hand curb or edge of the street as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or a vehicle proceeding in the same direction.

- (4) When an individual operating a pedalcycle and a vehicle enter an intersection from different streets at approximately the same time, the operator of the vehicle or pedalcycle on the left shall yield the right-of-way to the vehicle or pedalcycle on the right.
- (5) No golf carts, motor-driven cycles, mopeds, automobiles, all-terrain vehicles or utility task vehicles may be operated on a pedalcycle path or pedalcycle lane unless specifically designated by the Town.
- d. Limitations of riding abreast. Persons riding pedalcycles upon a street shall not ride more than two (2) abreast except on pedalcycle paths and/or pedalcycle lanes or parts of streets set aside for the exclusive use of pedalcycles by the Town of Bloomsburg Council.
- e. Slower than prevailing speeds. A pedalcycle operated at a slower than a posted prevailing speed shall be driven in the right-hand lane when available for traffic, or as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the street except when preparing for a left turn at an intersection.
- f. Right-Of-Way to Pedestrians. A person operating a pedalcycle upon a street shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and shall give an audible signal, by way of bell, horn or voice before overtaking and passing a pedestrian. A person operating an EPAMD upon a sidewalk and/or street shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and shall give an audible signal, by way of bell, horn or voice before overtaking and passing a pedestrian.
- g. Passengers Illegal. A person operating a pedalcycle shall not ride other than upon or astride a permanent and regular seat attached thereto. A pedalcycle shall not be used to carry more persons on it at one time than the number for which it is designed and equipped by the manufacturer of the same, except that an adult rider, age eighteen (18) years and above may transport a child in a pedalcycle child carrier which is securely attached to the pedalcycle or in a trailer which is towed by a pedalcycle. If the passenger is a minor weighing forty (40) pounds or less, the carrier shall have adequate provision for retaining the minor in place and for protecting the minor from the moving parts of the pedalcycle.
- h. Clinging to Vehicles Prohibited. No person riding upon any pedalcycle shall attach the same or himself to any moving vehicle upon a street for the purpose of being pulled along with the moving vehicle.
- i. Carrying Articles. No person operating a pedalcycle shall carry any package, bundle or article which prevents the driver from keeping at least one hand upon the handlebars or which obstructs the driver's vision.
- j. Improper Riding, Trick Riding, Racing.
 - (1) No person operating a pedalcycle or EPAMD as may be permitted by this chapter from a street, sidewalk or designated bicycle/pedalcycle and/or motorized-driven cycle or motorized cycle path shall participate in any race, speed or endurance contest, unless such race or endurance contest has the written permission of the Town of Bloomsburg and is under the supervision of the Town of Bloomsburg Police.
 - (2) No person riding or operating a pedalcycle shall perform any acrobatic, fancy or stunt riding upon any street, sidewalk or bicycle/pedalcycle path unless it is an organized activity approved by the Town of Bloomsburg and under the

supervision of the Town of Bloomsburg Police.

- k. Obedience to Traffic Control Devices.
- (1) All drivers operating a pedalcycle shall obey the instructions of official trafficcontrol devices applicable to vehicles, unless otherwise directed by a police officer or any appropriately attired person authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic.
- (2) Whenever authorized signs are erected indicating that no right, left, or "U" turn is permitted, no driver of a pedalcycle shall disobey the direction of any such sign, except where such person dismounts from the pedalcycle to make any such turn, in which event such person shall then obey the regulations applicable to pedestrians.
- (3) Whenever authorized signs are erected, either permanently or temporarily, indicating that a road is closed all drivers of pedalcycles must dismount and travel through such areas on foot, thereby abiding to all laws and ordinances regulating pedestrian traffic unless it is an organized pedalcycle activity approved by the Town of Bloomsburg and under the supervision of the Town of Bloomsburg Police.
- (4) Pedalcycles may be walked subject to all provisions of law applicable to pedestrians.
- I. Stopping, Turning, Signaling.
- (1) No pedalcycle driver shall suddenly stop, slow down or turn without giving an arm signal required by State law for the operation of motor vehicles. The proper arm signals are as follow:
 - (a) For a left turn, the hand and arm shall be extended horizontally.
 - (b) For a right turn, the hand and arm shall be extended upward or a rider may also signal a right turn by extending the right hand and arm horizontally.
 - (c) To stop or decrease speed, the hand and arm shall be extended downward.
- (2) Every person riding or operating a pedalcycle intending to turn right at an intersection, shall approach the turning point in the line of traffic nearest the right-hand curb of the street.
- (3) Every person riding or driving a pedalcycle intending to turn left at an intersection, shall approach the point of turning in the line of traffic nearest to the center of the street. The pedalcycle driver, in turning left at an intersection, shall pass to the left of the center of the intersection before turning, unless otherwise directed by markers, buttons or signs, except upon one-way streets. At intersections where traffic is moving in opposite directions, if it is not safe for pedalcycles to make turns, as mentioned above, the pedalcycle driver shall stay in the right-hand lane and ride to the opposite corner, then dismount and walk the pedalcycle to the left-hand corner and proceed. Left-hand turns may also be made by riding to the opposite corner and then turning left and riding in normal riding position. Crosswalks shall be used when walking a pedalcycle through an intersection.

- (1) A person may park a pedalcycle on a sidewalk, unless prohibited or restricted by an official traffic control device. A pedalcycle parked on a sidewalk shall not impede the normal and reasonable movement of pedestrian or other traffic.
- (2) No person shall chain or secure a pedalcycle to any Town stop sign, parking sign or any other official sign, nor any Town trees or parking meters.
- (3) Bicycle/pedalcycle racks are to be used, where available. No person shall chain or secure a Pedalcycle to a bicycle/pedalcycle rack within a street right- of-way in excess of 72 hours. No person shall chain or secure a bicycle to a bicycle/pedalcycle rack in a municipal parking facility in excess of 30 days.
- (4) A pedalcycle may be parked on the street at any angle to the curb or edge of the street at any location where parking is allowed in the Town.
- (5) A pedalcycle may be parked on the street abreast of another pedalcycle near the size of the street at any location where parking is allowed.
- (6) A person shall not park a pedalcycle on a street in such a manner as to obstruct the movement of a legally parked motor vehicle.
- n. Owner's Consent to Operate. No person shall intentionally take or ride a pedalcycle without the consent of the owner.

o. Helmets.

- (1) A person under the age of 12 years of age shall not operate a pedalcycle or ride as a passenger on a pedalcycle unless the person is wearing a pedalcycle helmet meeting the standards of the American National Standards Institute, the American Society for Testing and Materials, The Snell Memorial Foundation's Standards for Protective Headgear for Use in Bicycling or any other nationally recognized standard for pedalcycle helmet approval. This subsection applies to any person who rides:
 - (a) Upon a pedalcycle while in a restraining seat attached to a pedalcycle; or
 - (b) In a trailer towed by a pedalcycle.
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any violation of subsection (1), above, is punishable by a fine, including all penalties, assessments and court costs imposed on the convicted person not to exceed \$25.00. The parent or legal guardian having control or custody of a person under 12 years of age whose conduct violates this subsection shall be jointly and severally liable with the person in the amount of the fine imposed.
- (3) As used in this subsection, the term "wearing a pedalcycle helmet" means having a pedalcycle helmet of good fit fastened securely upon the head with the helmet straps.
- p. Operation of Pedalcycle with Electric Assist. No person under 16 years of age shall operate a pedalcycle with electric assist on any street in the Town.

§ 3-103. Safety Equipment Required.

a. Every pedalcycle and EPAMD when in use between sunset and sunrise, shall be equipped on the front with a lamp which emits a white light intended to illuminate

the pedalcycle and/or EPAMD's operator's path and visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front, red reflector facing to the rear, and an amber reflector on each side. Operators of pedalcycles and/or EPAMD's may supplement the required front lamp with a white flashing lamp, light-emitting diode or similar device to enhance their visibility to other traffic and with a lamp emitting a red flashing lamp, light-emitting diode or similar device visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear.

A lamp, or lamps, may be worn by the operator of a pedalcycle, or EPAMD and shall be deemed to comply with the requirements of this section if the lamp(s) can be seen at the distances specified.

b. Every pedalcycle shall be equipped with a braking system which will stop the pedalcycle within 15 feet from an initial speed of 15 miles-per-hour on a dry, level and clean pavement.

§3-104. Compliance with Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code

Any person operating a pedalcycle, motorized pedalcycle and/or motor-driven cycle in the Town shall do so strictly in accordance with the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, including, without limitation 75 Pa. C.S. §3501 et. seq. as the same may be changed or amended from time to time.

§ 3-105. Penalties and Enforcement.

Any person shall, upon conviction thereof for violation of this ordinance, be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed \$50 and costs of prosecution. This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Town of Bloomsburg Police Department.

§ 3-106. Impounding and Sale of Pedalcycles.

Whenever any pedalcycle is impounded for violation of these ordinances or violations under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code and not reclaimed by the legal owner or custodian, it shall be held by the Town of Bloomsburg Police for a period not less than 90 days before disposal. Similarly, any pedalcycle found or turned into the Town of Bloomsburg Police as abandoned property will be held for a period not less than 90 days before disposal. Any pedalcycle held by the Town of Bloomsburg Police and not reclaimed by the legal owner may be sold at public auction or destroyed after 90 days.

§3-107. Pedalcycle Paths and Pedalcycle Lanes.

The Town shall have the right, from time to time to designate pedalcycle paths and pedalcycle lanes within the Town.

§3-108. Rule and Regulations.

The Town shall have the right to adopt rules and regulations with respect to the operation of pedalcycles withing the Town, including without limitation, on pedalcycle paths and pedalcycle lanes. Any rules and regulations adopted shall be enforceable under this ordinance.

§ 3-107. Repealer.

This Ordinance shall repeal Chapter 3, Part 1 of the Code of the Town of Bloomsburg in its entirety and be effective five (5) days after its adoption by the Town of Bloomsburg Council.
