Public Works & Environmental Committee Minutes Tuesday, June 3, 2025, 10:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. Committee members James Garman and Nick McGaw were in attendance along with Jaclyn Kressler (Zoom). Town Manager/Secretary/Treasurer Lisa Dooley, Director of Public Works John Fritz, Director of Code Enforcement Mike Reffeor, Director of Governmental Services Charles Fritz and Administrative Assistant Christine Meeker. Also in attendance were MJ Mahon, Brian Bercher, Dawn Moore (Zoom) and Jared Fenstermacher.

Gregg Wirth spoke to the Committee regarding the vandalism at the Town Park restrooms. Closing the restrooms is not a reasonable option, it creates an unsanitary condition and will limit the visitors to the park hostage

There were no comments from the public for the final public hearing on the annual action plan- Community Development Block Grant

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Jordan, and voted on unanimously, the Committee approved the May 6, 2025 meeting minutes.

The Committee reviewed the grant list.

Charles Fritz presented the Walkability study that was done several years ago by Simone Collins. Grant sources open in March-April 2026 and are open for a four-year period.

Council priorities: Sidewalks and curbs cuts, finish the pool project, possible trail connections. Staff would like Council members to bring 5 items/ideas forward for discussion of future projects at the next Committee meeting.

On a motion by J. Jordan, seconded by N. McGaw, and voted on unanimously, the Committee recommends Council approve of the PPL solar interconnectivity fee in the amount of \$5,300 for the Public Works location regarding the solar project.

The Committee discussed the phase two quotes for the Columbia Child Development Center to close the ridge vent to keep the bats out of the building. No complaints have been received since the prior work was done so the consensus is to wait and see.

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Jordan, and voted on unanimously, the Committee recommends Council approve the following SEDA-COG invoices.

- a. -2020 HUD Entitlement Program- \$6,233.
- b. -2021 HUD Entitlement Program- \$3,397.
- c. -2023 HUD Entitlement Program- \$6,960.
- d. -2024 HUD Entitlement Program- \$12,250.

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Jordan, and voted on unanimously, the Committee recommends Council take no action on the quote for Glick Inc. to repair the garage door opener at the Public Work building.

The road diet discussion will be placed on the June 9th Council agenda for full discussion.

The Committee reviewed the Town Park safety walkthrough. Public Works will address these issues and report back. Questions arose regarding the ownership/responsibility of the upkeep on the bocce court. Staff will contact Laura Davis.

On a motion by N. McGaw, seconded by J. Garman, and voted on unanimously, the Committee recommends Council approve a quote from Mark Conner Electric LLC in the amount of \$3,310 for replacing the control panel at the Norris E. Rock Memorial Pool.

J. Fritz submitted a list of streets, with a priority number that require paving in the next few years. Pot holes are being fixed as calls come in.

The committee discussed vandalism at the town park. Committee members are not in favor of closing the bathrooms. Committee members suggest a meeting with the police department.
