Airport fuel farm project- construction to start May 2023.

Crack and re-seal project:

- Total contract time is 12 calendar days
- Project consists of two phases, crack repair and remarking
- Final markings will be applied 30 days after pavement repair is complete
- Runway will be closed each day when working
- Other than for a single overnight closure during the crack repair phase, the runway will reopen each evening
- Weekend work must be requested in advance and may only be scheduled to make up for days lost due to weather midweek

Present were Council Member James Garman, Alex Dubil, Justin Hummel, Phil Polstra and BJ Teichman. Other people present was Lisa Dooley Town Manager/ Secretary and Treasurer.

On a motion by J. Garman, seconded by P. Prout, and voted on unanimously, the meeting minutes from the 3/2/2022 were unanimously approved with no changes.

The airport fuel farm was discussed. There are two main systems: QT Pod and Fuel Master. Currently the price is \$6.14 a gallon. Prior to prices increasing, it was \$4.80. It was discussed that during the fuel project we won't be out of fuel on site.

The master site plan listed two twin engines and the Town currently has three twin engines based at the Town.

P. Prout mentioned that there is a free flying day with the young eagles and there are currently 24 registered. A couple of students are wanting to get their license. The club is working with the Children's Museum for future youth programs and scholarships. There was 1 scholarship given in 2021, 2 in 2022 and 3 planned in 2023.
